## **BRIGADIER GENERAL DENNIS G. LUCAS**

Brigadier General Dennis G. Lucas is the Commander of the California Air National Guard. He is responsible for command and control oversight of five major field-level organizations comprised of nearly 5,000 military and civilian personnel serving at eleven locations within California. As Commander, he serves at the senior Air National Guard officer responsible for providing operationally trained, equipped and mission-ready forces to support national defense requirements world wide and emergency response, relief, and recovery operations throughout California.



In 1971, General Lucas graduated from Officer Training School at Lackland AFB, Texas. After graduating from Undergraduate Navigator Training at Mather AFB, California, he continued training in the F-4E at Homestead AFB, Florida. Upon completion of F-4 training, he was assigned to Korat Royal Thai Air Base, Thailand, where he flew combat missions during the Vietnam War. He also completed flying assignments in England and the United States.

General Lucas joined the California Air National Guard in 1980 where he held a variety of positions until 1987 when he transferred to the State Headquarters holding positions as the Education and Training Officer, and Executive Officer. In 1999, he was assigned as the Director of Command, Control, Communications and Computers and in 2000, General Lucas was appointed as the Assistant Adjutant General, Air, for the California Air National Guard. In September 2004, General Lucas was appointed as the Commander. General Lucas is a Master Navigator with more than 2,400 hours, including 130 combat missions in the F-4 in Southeast Asia.
